

Recycling Information

RECYCLEABLE MATERIALS

Cardboard – Empty and **flatten** boxes. Please remove and discard Styrofoam, packing peanuts and plastic wrap into plastic recycling bin, before placing cardboard in recycling section.



Paperboard – Dry food boxes – i.e. cereal, cake mix, cracker, beer and pop cases, clean pizza boxes, shoe and shirt boxes. We also accept frozen food paperboard, milk cartons and juice boxes. **Please put paperboard and waxed paperboard in with the cardboard.**



Paper – Magazines, newspaper, catalogs, white paper, coloured paper, phone books, letters and flyers.

Steel and Aluminum – Steel, tin and aluminum cans.



Plastics- All plastics **#1 thru #7**. These include all soda or detergent bottles, grocery bags, water and shampoo bottles, milk jugs, other plastic food containers, empty oil jugs, yogurt containers and **STYROFOAM!**

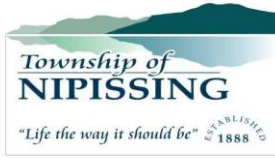
Some examples of plastics #1 thru #7

Glass – Yes, we now recycle glass at the landfill. Please place glass in with the plastics and tin.

NO RECYCLABLES ACCEPTED IN REGULAR HOUSEHOLD WASTE



	Plastic bottles for soft drinks, water, juice, mouthwash, peanut butter, mayonnaise, salad dressing, etc.
	Bottles for milk, water, juice, cosmetics, shampoo, detergent, household cleaners and grocery bags.
	Food trays and cling film. Bottles for cooking oil, water jugs and mineral water.
	Plastic bags, grocery bags, dry cleaning bags and some bottles.
	Yogurt containers, margarine tubs, straws, caps, microwavable meal trays.
	Meal trays, egg cartons (Styrofoam), takeout food containers, coat hangers, clear trays, meat trays and protective packaging for electronic goods and toys.
	Plastic plates, three and five gallon water reusable water bottles.

****Please bring your Hazardous Waste to the HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DEPOT in NORTH BAY at 112 Patton Street.
Open Year-Round – Wednesday to Saturday from 8am – 6pm.**

Residents should take their HHW products to the **HAZARDOUS WASTE DEPOT IN NORTH BAY, FREE OF CHARGE**. The following are examples of Household Hazardous waste that should be taken to the HHW Depot:

- Aerosol cans
- Antifreeze
- Asphalt & roofing tar
- Automotive batteries
- Bug and tar removers
- Car and wax polish
- Degreasers
- Disinfectant
- Drain Cleaner
- Engine / radiator flushes
- Grease & lubes
- **Household batteries**
- Household cleansers

DO NOT BRING THE FOLLOWING TO THE HHW DEPOT:

- PCB's
- Ammunition
- Pathological Waste
- Unidentified Products

Preparing HHW for **SAFE & EASY TRANSPORT**
All materials should be left in the original container to allow easy identification of the contents.

Do not mix products together.

- Wastes should be sealed and labeled.
- Bring all hazardous waste in a cardboard box or rigid container.
- Collect household batteries in a small bag, plastic container or coffee can.
- Load the vehicle just before leaving to minimize the buildup of fumes.

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

Reduce the amount of hazardous products that you use around your home by replacing them with non-hazardous or less hazardous alternatives.

BAKING SODA is inexpensive to buy and it cleans, deodorizes and softens water.

PURE SOAP biodegrades (decomposes naturally) safely and completely.

WHITE VINEGAR helps remove grease and grime and deodorizes as well.

BORAX cleans, disinfects and also helps to soften water.

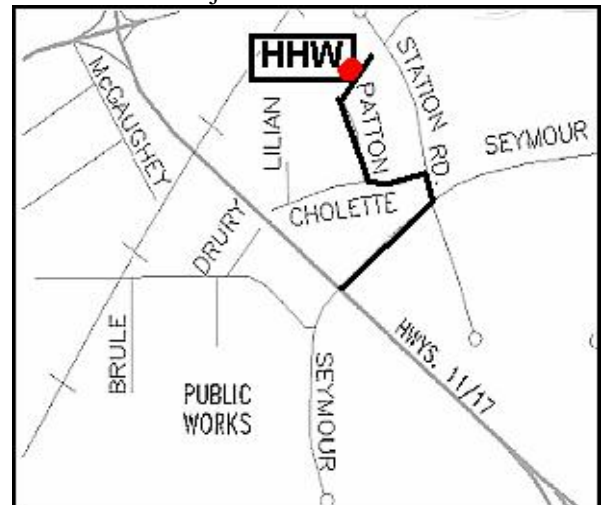
WASHING SODA cuts grease, disinfects and removes stains.

THE PAINT RE-USE PROGRAM is a waste reduction –re-use program located at the HHW Depot. Good quality household products can be picked by the residents free of charge. This includes products such as paint, stain and varnishes.

SAFE USE OF HAZARDOUS PRODUCTS

If you must use hazardous products, keep the following tips in mind in order to minimize your exposure to chemicals and potential danger to the environment:

- Buy only what you need.
- Give away what you do not use.
- Share seldom used products.
- Buy alternative products that are less hazardous.
- **Never** mix products together.
- Choose products with child resistant caps.
- Safely store all hazardous materials out of reach of children and pets.
- Use products in a well ventilated area.
- Never bury hazardous waste or pour it into the ground-it can contaminate groundwater and effect adjacent water bodies.
