CRIMINAL RECORD CHECKS

Completed by the police service with jurisdiction over where you reside.

Know which level you need.

1. Police Criminal Record Check (Level 1)

Criminal convictions, absolute & conditional discharges (1-3 years) and findings of Guilt under the *Youth Criminal Justice Act* within the applicable disclosure period.

2. Police Information Check (Level 2)

Police Criminal Record Check + outstanding matters such as criminal charges, warrants, judicial orders, peace bonds, probation & prohibition orders.

3. Police Vulnerable Sector Check

Police Criminal Record Check + Police Information check + search of Pardoned Sex Offender Database and, in exceptional cases, non-conviction information.

Agency/employer request letter required.

Fees:

All levels of searches - \$25.00

Volunteers - Free (agency letter required)

Fingerprints (if required) - \$26.50 + R.C.M.P. processing \$25.00 = \$51.50

WHEN TO USE 911

The Ontario Provincial Police receives hundreds of 911 calls per year. Unfortunately, many of these calls are not emergencies. When the O.P.P. receives a 911 call, OPP officers are required to attend. Often times the 911 calls are not emergencies and could be resolved without police attendance or intervention.

Call 911 to:

- > STOP A CRIME IN PROGRESS
- Report a Fire
- Save a life
- > In any EMERGENCY situation

When you call 911, the operator will ask: "911, do you require Police, Fire or Ambulance?" Choose the most appropriate response for your situation.

WHEN TO USE <u>1-888-310-1122</u>

When you have to call the O.P.P. for any non 911 situation, this is the nonemergency telephone number. This number is operational 24 hours – 7 days a week.

By dialing 1-888-310-1122, you will be connected to the nearest Ontario Provincial Police Provincial Communications Centre who will process your call.

NORTH BAY O.P.P. DETACHMENT <u>CLUSTER</u>

Many people attend the North Bay, Mattawa and Powassan Detachments in person expecting that they will be able to promptly make a report or speak to an officer.

Our officers are routinely on patrol throughout the communities we serve, which means an officer might not be immediately available to speak to you at detachment.

Therefore, it is recommended you call 1-888-310-1122 to request police assistance. Record the incident number created by the call taker.

The North Bay detachment is the administrative centre for the North Bay cluster which includes North Bay, Mattawa and Powassan detachments. We provide counter service to the public at the North Bay and Mattawa offices only during the administrative business hours noted below. Messages left on the detachment answering machine will be retrieved on the next business day. Calls for service/police assistance should be directed to the Provincial Communication Centre.
