Clear Bags Only



The Township of Nipissing implemented a **Clear Bag Program** in 2013. Bags must be clear or tinted as long as the contents are visible to the landfill staff.

To address privacy concerns: regarding personal items related to health/hygiene waste, one solid colour privacy bag – no larger than 20" x 22" (approximate size of a grocery bag) per clear bag will be accepted.

Septic and Human Waste are NOT accepted at the Township of Nipissing Landfill sites.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

An agreement is in place with the City of North Bay for Nipissing Township residents to use the Household Hazardous Waste Depot NORTH BAY at **112 Patton Street**. Open Year-Round – Wednesday to Saturday from 8am – 6pm.

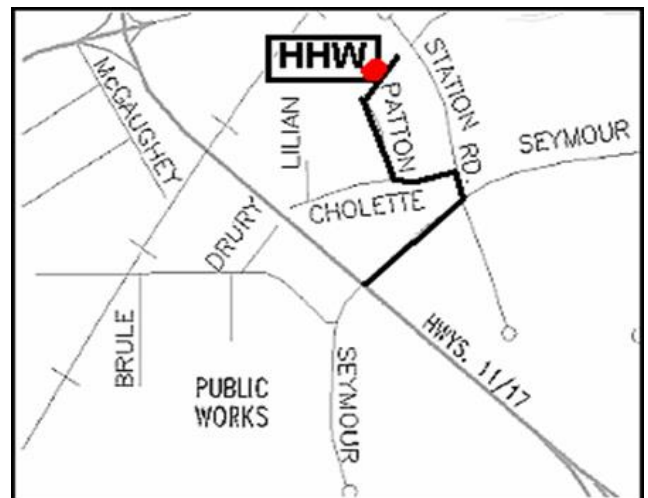
The following are examples of Household Hazardous waste that **should be taken** to the HHW Depot:

- Aerosol cans
- Antifreeze
- Asphalt & roofing tar
- Automotive batteries
- Bug and tar removers
- Car and wax polish
- Degreasers
- Disinfectant
- Drain Cleaner
- Engine / radiator flushes
- Grease & lubes
- Household batteries
- Household cleansers
- Propane tanks (big and small)
- Light bulbs (Florescent, etc.)

DO NOT bring the following items to the HHW Depot:

- PCB's
- Ammunition
- Pathological Waste
- Unidentified Products

THE PAINT RE-USE PROGRAM is a waste reduction –re-use program located at the HHW Depot. Good quality household products can be picked by residents free of charge. This includes products such as paint, stain and varnishes.

***CHANGES* HOUSEHOLD RECYCLEABLE MATERIALS:**

Cardboard – Empty and flatten boxes. **Please remove and discard Styrofoam, packing peanuts and plastic wrap into the Household Garbage NOT recycling.*

Paperboard – Dry food boxes such as cereal, cake mix, crackers, beer and pop cases, clean pizza boxes and shoe and shirt boxes. Frozen food paperboard, milk cartons and juice boxes are also accepted.

Paper – Magazines, newspaper, catalogs, white paper, coloured paper, phone books, letters and flyers.

Steel and Aluminum – Steel, tin and aluminum cans.

Plastics – All plastics #1 thru #7. These include all empty and rinsed soda or detergent bottles, water and shampoo bottles, milk jugs, other plastic food containers yogurt containers.

****Please note: GLASS, PLASTIC BAGS and STYROFOAM are not accepted recyclable materials – please place in household waste.***

ONTARIO ELECTRONIC STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM:

The Township of Nipissing participates in the OES Program where used and unwanted electronics including computers, televisions and cell phones are collected and recycled. Look for the brown containers located at each landfill site.

Items accepted include:

Computer monitors, televisions, desktop computers, portable computers, computer peripherals such as keyboards. Photocopiers, printers, scanners and old fax machines. Cellular devices, pagers, home theatres as well as digital cameras, speakers and much more.

CLOTHESLINE PROGRAM – Textile Diversion Program

The Township of Nipissing has textile collection bins located at each municipal landfill. The Clothesline Program, operated through Diabetes Canada, collects textiles including: clothing, ties, stuffed toys, blankets, belts, socks, linens, curtains, hats, bags, towels, pillows, mitts, shoes, sheets and sleeping bags.

These items are diverted from the landfill and help bring in donations to Diabetes Canada.
