Effect January 1, 2022

What is the Resource Recovery & Circular Economy Act, 2016 and how does it affect you?

- The vision of the legislation is a waste free future.
- By encouraging innovation through producer responsibility, we are protecting the environment & reducing waste.

What is Circular Economy?

- Ontario is shifting from linear economy where natural resources are extracted, manufactured into products, consumed and then thrown away.
- In a circular economy, products and packaging are designed to minimize waste and then be recovered, reused, recycled and integrated back into production.

An Example: Tires

- On January 1st 2019, tire producers moved to the individual producer responsibility framework.
- The Township of Nipissing Landfill No Longer Accepts Tires.

The Township of Nipissing participates in programs to divert many materials from our landfill, such as:

- Textiles
- Electronics
- Scrap Steel
- Blue Box (Recycled) Materials including Plastics 1-7, Cardboard & Aluminum/Tin
- Household Hazardous Waste (City of North Bay HHW Depot)

Stewardship Ontario uses the Municipal Funding Allocation Model to provide payments to the Township to help cover the costs of the recycling services based on the amounts diverted from the landfills.

Sorting is the best way to help keep costs low. The more accurate the loads and weights, the better for everyone.

Sorting Your Recycling















- Paper; Paperboard & Cardboard: Magazines, Newspaper, Catalogs, White/Colored Paper, Phone Books, Letters & Flyers, Dry Food Boxes Such As Cereal, Cake Mix, Cracker, Pop, Beer, Clean Pizza Boxes, Shoe/Shirt Boxes. Frozen Food Paper Board, Milk Cartons & Juice Boxes Accepted.
- Plastic: All Plastics # 1 thru # 7. These Include All Soda or Detergent Bottles, Water & Shampoo Bottles, Milk Jugs, Empty Oil Jugs, Yogurt Containers, Other Plastic Food Containers.
- Steel & Aluminum: Steel, *Tin & Aluminum Cans*
