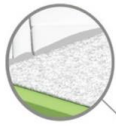

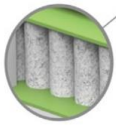
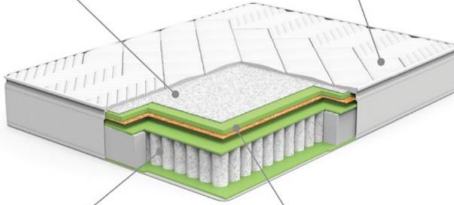
FOAM PADDING

- Turned into carpet underlayment or animal bed padding



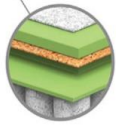
COTTON

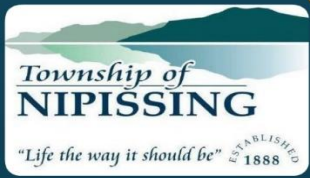
TOWNSHIP OF NIPISSING **LANDFILL UPDATES**

SOONER THAN MOST OF US WOULD LIKE, WE WILL ONCE AGAIN BE FACING SNOW AND ICE DURING OUR REGULAR TRAVELS. THE TOWNSHIP ASKS RESIDENTS TO HAVE REGARD TO THE FOLLOWING.

SIGNIFICANT WEATHER EVENT

- RAIN FALL WARNINGS
- WIND WARNINGS
- SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNINGS
- SNOWFALL WARNINGS
- FREEZING RAIN WARNINGS
- TORNADO WARNINGS

OR OTHER INCLEMENT WEATHER THAT MAY OCCUR AS PER ENVIRONMENT CANADA'S PUBLIC WEATHER ALERTS

PLEASE BE ADVISED:

THAT A SIGNIFICANT WEATHER EVENT IS DEFINED AS AN APPROACHING OR OCCURRING WEATHER HAZARD WITH THE POTENTIAL TO POSE A SIGNIFICANT DANGER TO THE USERS OF HIGHWAYS (STREETS AND ROADS) WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY.

THIS MAY HAVE A DIRECT IMPACT ON THE (HILLS) LOCATED IN YOUR RESIDENTIAL AREA. AS A RESULT OF A ROAD CLOSURE, THE TOWNSHIP OF NIPISSING WILL MONITOR THE CONDITION OF THE ROAD(S) AND MAY LIMIT ACCESS TO EMERGENCY VEHICLES ONLY.

IF A DECLARATION OF A SIGNIFICANT WEATHER EVENT OCCURS, THE TOWNSHIP REMAINS DILIGENT IN PROVIDING CONTINUOUS WEATHER MAINTENANCE TO ENSURE PUBLIC SAFETY. DRIVERS AND PEDESTRIANS ARE ENCOURAGED TO USE APPROPRIATE LEVEL OF CAUTION WHEN TRAVELLING DURING THIS EVENT AND ASKED TO BE MINDFUL OF PUBLIC WORKS AS THEY CONTINUE TO MAINTAIN TOWNSHIP ROADS.

WE ASK RESIDENTS TO CONTINUE TO MONITOR THE TOWNSHIP WEBSITE AND SOCIAL MEDIA CHANNELS FOR FURTHER UPDATES AND ANNOUNCEMENTS. WHEN A SIGNIFICANT WEATHER EVENT OCCURS POSING DANGEROUS CONDITIONS TO THE PUBLIC AND OPERATIONS, EQUIPMENT WILL NOT BE PLACED IN SERVICE, UNTIL DEEMED AN ACCEPTABLE RISK.

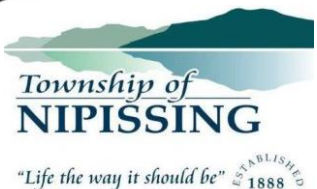

THURSDAY, SEPT. 28, 2023, IS ONTARIO'S FIRST TEST YOUR SMOKE ALARM DAY!

Having working smoke alarms is your best chance to keep you and your family safe in the event of a fire.

Test smoke alarms at least once a month. If they're not working, change the batteries or replace the unit.

Test your alarm, whether it is battery powered or hard wired, by pressing the test button on your smoke alarm. The alarm should make a loud beeping sound.

Change the batteries at least once a year or whenever the low-battery warning sounds.

Smoke alarms don't last forever. They wear out and need to be replaced every 10 years.

Working smoke alarms save lives, cutting the risk of dying in a home fire in half.

Ontario law requires working smoke alarms on every storey of the home and outside all sleeping areas. Failure to comply with smoke alarm legislation could result in a fine.

If you need help, or advice about smoke alarms, contact your local fire department.

INSTALL & TEST ALARMS

Carbon monoxide alarms should be tested at least once a month.



PLUG SPACE HEATERS DIRECTLY INTO OUTLETS

Never use an extension cord or power strip.



HEAT YOUR HOME SAFELY

Keep anything that can burn 3 feet away from a fireplace, wood stove, or space heater.



KEEP CHIMNEY & VENTS CLEAN

Hire a qualified professional to clean and inspect your chimney and vents at least once a year.



NEVER USE CANDLES FOR EMERGENCY LIGHTING

Always use flash lights and stock up on extra batteries.



USE FIREPLACE SAFELY

Always use a metal or heat-tempered glass screen when using your fireplace.

KID'S FIRE SAFETY

Make and practice an escape plan in case of an emergency



Educate children to call 911 from outside the home

Teach children to never play with matches or lighters



Establish a plan for young children who can not get outside by themselves



PET FIRE SAFETY

Keep an emergency kit in a safe location for easy access in case your family needs to evacuate the home



Pet proof home for potential fire hazards such as stove knobs or loose electrical cords



Keep up-to-date identification and contact information on your pet at all times



Keep a rescue alert sticker visible for first responders

Lithium-Ion Battery Safety



Lithium-ion batteries supply power to many kinds of devices including smart phones, laptops, e-scooters and e-bikes, e-cigarettes, smoke alarms, toys, and even cars. If not used correctly, or if damaged, these batteries can catch on fire or explode.

The problem

- These batteries store a large amount of energy in a small amount of space.
- Sometimes batteries are not used the right way; batteries not designed for a specific use can be dangerous.
- Like any product, a small number of these batteries are defective. They can overheat, catch fire, or explode.

Safety Tips

- Purchase and use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- Only use the battery that is designed for the device.
- Put batteries in the device the right way.
- Only use the charging cord that came with the device.
- Do not charge a device under your pillow, on your bed, or on a couch.
- Do not keep charging the device or device battery after it is fully charged.
- Keep batteries at room temperature when possible. Do not charge them at temperatures below 32°F (0°C) or above 105°F (40°C).
- Store batteries away from anything that can catch fire.

Signs of a Problem

Stop using the battery if you notice these problems: odor, change in color, too much heat, change in shape, leaking, or odd noises. If it is safe to do so, move the device away from anything that can catch fire. Call 9-1-1.

Battery Disposal

- Do not put lithium-ion batteries in the trash.
- Recycling is always the best option.
- Take them to a battery recycling location or contact your community for disposal instructions.
- Do not put discarded batteries in piles.

Charging an E-bike

Charge your battery in a flat, dry area away from children, direct sunlight, liquids, tripping hazards, and in a location where the e-bike is not at risk of falling.

Know before you go, and check it out once you get there!

Fire Safety

- Smoke alarms should be on every level of the home, outside each sleeping area and inside every bedroom.
- Carbon monoxide (CO) alarms should be on every level of the home outside sleeping areas.
- Have a fire escape plan (two ways out each room).
- Make sure there is a fire extinguisher in the home.

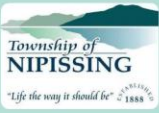
Child Safety

- Avoid deadly tip overs, don't let children climb on furniture.
- Keep cleaning supplies in a locked cabinet or out of reach of children.
- Keep all window cords out of reach of children.
- Keep baby's sleep space free from pillows and blankets and use cribs that meet CPSC standards.
- Protect children – Be aware of a potentially deadly gap between interior and exterior doors of home elevators.

Pool Safety Tips

- Always watch kids in and around the water.
- Keep children away from pool drains.
- Know how to perform CPR on children and adults.
- Make sure kids learn to swim.

Keep the address of the home visible in case of emergency
