


14% OF THE RESIDENTS PARTICIPATED IN THE SURVEY.

COUNCIL MEETINGS ON YOUTUBE, ELECTRONIC DELIVERY – COMMENTS AND BACKGROUND:

- 12 responses received were not aware that these options existed.
- 7 responses stated that the information sometimes or occasionally assisted in keeping them informed.
- 5 responses were relating to poor internet service, slow buffering, poor quality due to connectivity issues.





Election 2026 – Voting Options






Election Options

Challenges of Traditional Voting:


 Time consuming to find and train staff, count ballots, inconvenient to non-resident property owners.

- Not able to do a re-count of internet voting.
- Not all areas of the Township have reliable internet.

The *Municipal Act*, 2001, S. 239(7) provides that a municipality or a committee of a municipality shall record without note or comment all resolutions, decisions and other proceedings at a meeting.

Resolutions are recorded in the Minutes, as required, because they are decisions made by Council. If any member of the public has a question regarding a Resolution or a By-Law, the record can be made available to them at the office for review or a Staff member would be happy to help explain the item. Council meetings are also recorded and the recorded meetings are available on the Township of Nipissing YouTube channel for public viewing at any time.


Council meetings are governed by the Procedural By-Law, Number 2022-34. A copy of the By-Law is available on the Township website, Municipal Info, By-Laws.

Council will hear from those wishing to speak by Delegation of Council. The process to schedule a delegation is available at: https://nipissingtownship.com/municipal-information/mayor-and-councillors/

The reason for this process is to ensure that the public is advised of all items to be discussed in a Council meeting. The Agenda provides the information Council will be reviewing and deciding on for public information. If someone is permitted to address Council on a matter not listed on the Agenda and not scheduled, it may result in a topic of discussion taking place without all parties to the discussion represented.

Items placed on the Agenda for Council consideration are items that Council can make a decision on, provide support for or are directly related to their role as Council members. In order to provide Council with all information that may be required on a topic, a required duty of Staff per the *Municipal Act*, information on the subject matter must come to Staff for review and proper placement on the Agenda. This also allows for the most efficient and effective use of Council's time at meetings and the operation of the municipality.

ROADS DEPARTMENT

*The Township of Nipissing is responsible for the maintenance of all municipal roads, 302 kms in total.

Provincial Highways are under the care and control of the Ministry of Transportation. Currently Highways 522, 534 and 654 are under a maintenance contract between the MTO and Fowler Construction.


Municipal staff are not permitted to do work on a Provincial Highway. Township Staff are not able to action complaints or comments received on the status of a Provincial Highway.

WASTE MANAGEMENT - COMMENTS AND BACKGROUND ON BAG LIMITS

7 regarding the possibility of garbage being left at road side or in the bush if a bag limit was implemented.

- 16 comments indicated that 2 bags per week would not be enough.
- 12 comments indicated that 2 bags per week would be too much.
- 24 comments indicated that 2 bags per week would be adequate.
- 4 comments indicated that they disagreed with bag limits.
- 1 comment suggested an increased limit at holiday or special occasion times.

Bag limit quantity was based on 2 bags per week = 2 x 52= 104 bags
Plus an additional 6 bags for special occasion overflow.
Total of 110 bags per year permitted per residence.

24 comments were received asking how the bag limits would be monitored and tracked.

A punch card landfill entry permit system would be introduced with one box on the card being marked off for each bag brought to the landfill.

9 comments were requesting clarification on if recycling and other diversion programs were included in the bag limit.

Household garbage bag limit would be the only limit. Recycling would not be limited in any way.

5 comments were regarding the scheduled use of landfills, bi-weekly, weekly, monthly etc.

With the use of a punch card system, a household would have 110 bags to use at any time during the year. This would accommodate any landfill use schedule of bi-weekly, monthly or weekly.

7 comments addressed size limits on the bags.

The size of a bag is considered a regular garbage bag of 74 Litres or similar. By-Law Number 2020-27 provides the specific information on a privacy bag size within a clear bag.

2 comments were about stricter control on waste entering the landfill and recycling placed correctly.

WASTE MANAGEMENT - COMMENTS AND BACKGROUND ON BAG LIMITS continued

- This service is extremely important. Currently the staff at the landfill sites are tremendous. They deserve a "pat on the back" for their great work!
- I would like to take the opportunity to congratulate the staff so efficient, pleasant and helpful.
- Recycling efforts have improved past year good work.

Thank you for the positive feedback.

- (if there is a problem) the dumps been there forever and by the time it is full the Government will have figured out a way to fix the problem.
- Expand land.
- If Landfills are filling quickly is there a plan to purchase more land, or is there an alternative. Garbage has to go somewhere.

The landfill remaining space is declining as evidenced by annual comparison reports provided by consultants monitoring the locations. Bear Creek is estimated to have 4 years use remaining. Council authorized the investigation and application of expansion of the fill area from the Ministry of the Environment in 2023, we are still waiting for the outcome of that request.

Landfills across Ontario are filling and are expected to all reach capacity in close to 10 years. Municipal and Provincial levels of government are attempting to find options. At this time, increased waste reduction and improved recycling programs are providing some hope.

- Have a designated area for leaving items that others may like to take home.
- Used to be able to shop at the dump. I have some nice stuff I picked up in the past! An I have a compost bin.
- Could there be a designated spot for reusable items if not gone by day end in the dump at takers own risk. NOT ELECTRONICS but chairs/doors/mowers...Be clear as to what was allowed.

Scavenging or the removal of items from the landfill sites not permitted under agreements such as for electronics, textiles or blue box materials, is not allowed under the certificate of authority provided by the Ministry of the Environment for the landfill sites. The removal of items from the landfills also poses an increased liability risk for pest or rodent infestation of items and increased risk to public safety.



WASTE MANAGEMENT - COMMENTS AND BACKGROUND ON SCHEDULE CHANGES AND ORGANICS SITE

- 14 comments received that schedule is good as it is, no change required.
- 10 comments supporting the change to provide better scheduling for staff.
- 27 comments supporting the change in schedule.
- 7 comments requested adjusting the schedule to provide a more balanced time for the Wolfe Lake Landfill Mondays are more often holiday days.
- 2 comments support the change in hours as it supports those working shifts.
- 4 comments were concerned with reduced days at the landfills leading to discarded waste on roadside/bush.

Taking these comments and concerns into account, the following schedule could be adopted:

Wolfe Lake Landfill Thursday and Saturday, 9 am to 7 pm Bear Creek Landfill Friday and Sunday, 9 am to 7 pm

Landfills closed Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.


- I very much like the way things are going and I must say Dean is always great to see.






Fire permits are required 12 months per year. Once issued, the permit is permanent as long as ownership remains the same on the property.

Fire Prevention Comments:

Fire Prevention education messaging is included in newsletters mailed to property owners in the Spring and Fall as well as information being available on the Township website.

CodeRed Comments:

8 comments received regarding not being aware of the program.

4 comments received regarding the program not working properly.

CodRed allows the Township to notify a specific area or group or residents or the entire Township of emergency events if necessary.

Fire Permit Comments:

Daytime burning from April 1 to October 31 is not permitted within the Township of Nipissing. The reasons for this are logistical for fire suppression support reasons and for safety as winds are usually higher during the daytime.



Keeping those agencies informed is important in the event of an emergency.


