WHEREAS Canada and the United States have a shared history of friendship, respect and neighbourly relations;

AND WHEREAS Canada is a sovereign nation with a peaceful history of self-governance dating to its Confederation in 1867;

AND WHEREAS the Canadian identity is marked by a deep-rooted pride in its heritage and culture founded by French and British settlement, enriched by Indigenous culture and traditions and by more than a century and a half of multi-cultural immigration;

AND WHEREAS Canada has significant global standing, consistently supporting its allies, including the United States, in global conflicts such as two world wars, and wars in Korea and Afghanistan; and in international coalitions and in being consistently recognized as among the top countries in the world for quality of life;

AND WHEREAS newly elected President Donald Trump has suggested that with the use of economic force such as tariffs, Canada should become the 51st state of the United States;

AND WHEREAS President Trump, has now imposed tariffs on imports from Canada that will have a significant detrimental impact on the economic stability in both countries;

Chairperson Michel Champagne welcomes everyone.

Motion 01-03/20/25. Agenda was reviewed and the motion is included with discussion.

Motion 02-03/20/25. The Financial Statement was reviewed and the motion is included with discussion.

There was a discussion about Northern Producer Animal Health Network's busy year. The Ministry of Northern Development is reviewing The Veterinary Assistance Program, which hasn't been reviewed since 2004 despite multiple recommendations. The review started in Feb./24 and there has not been any results by March 2025. NPAHN's directors were on the first info taking session and we were told we could not speak on the VAP budget (which tied our hands) They have met with all the different interest groups like OFA, Beef Farmers of Ontario, Sheep groups and were supposed to interview individual farmers. NPAHN suggested interviewing farmers in areas that had no vets or shortage, and their reply was they had to go off the lists the contracted vets send in. None of the farmers that were at this meeting received a VAP Review phone call. Some farmers noted that clearer vet service audit letters would result in more responses.

Even though the review questions could not be about the budget NPAHN has sent several letters to MND, the MND minister, the Ministry of Agriculture and Food and Agri-business, and the Ag. Ministers (both for 2024) about what we think has to be revamped with the program. The mileage rate should be increased to \$2.40 from the longstanding \$1.20. That is 50% of the recommended milage rate from the College of Veterinaries of Ontario. The first 10 km from the clinic should be included in the paid milage. The 70 km. limit should be extended so the vet does not have to claim some clients as remote clients. The veterinaries say the new reporting system is difficult and needs to be steam lined. The further education rate should go up.

The Veterinary Act of Ontario was reviewed in 2023, and it was suggested that Registered Vet Techs, that were properly trained in large animal care, should be able to do more animal care under the guidance of a Vet clinic, and NPAHN agrees fully with that. Of course, the total budget would have to go up. The Designated Vets would like to see the changes but at the same time are

worried that the ministry will get rid of the program totally. They also believe if OMAFA took the program over it would be province wide and then there would be no extra incentive for vets in the North.

There is another sheet included with the minutes about NPAHN activities for your information.

Vet Reports

The e-mail from Dr. Fritz Verzijlenberg was read. He says that the large animal part of his business is only 10%. He is looking for another large animal vet because he could do more.

Dr. Olivia Stone gave a report. Unfortunately, the two new vets that were hired in 2023 both left in the late fall of 2024. Dr. Olivia and Dr. Christine have been very busy covering the areas, but the good news is that they have a vet that is taking the Ontario/Canadian accreditation through Springer. The vet cannot go out by himself yet, but he goes on calls with Dr. Olivia or Dr. Christine. Springer also has a new vet coming in April. He has a lot of experience with horses, and he will get "broke into other animals".

Springer clinic used \$44,000.00 plus on the 2024 contract, according to the report that was received at the Nov. NPAHN meeting. Verzijlenberg clinic uses \$1387.20 according to the report. The MND paid out \$747,025.00 out of the possible \$830,000.00. Fewer vets, less animals.

Motion 03-03/20/25 for two contracts the motion with discussion is included.

Chairperson Michel Champagne suggested that we had a good amount in the bank account and a conversation about what we could do with some money followed. Dr. Olivia was asked what she felt would be a good investment. She had said that their ultrasound machine will need replacing soon. Then she said that further education for RVT would be good. Motion 04-03/20/25 was made for funding toward RVT large animal training, with discussion and is included.

Chairperson and vise-chairperson selection.

Michel Champagne would like to set down as Chairperson and Mark Kunkle is no longer the vise-chairperson so nominations can be taken for a new Chair and vise.

Melanie Chenier nominated Lana Reading as Chairperson.
